Genealogy for Beginners

Part 1 – An introductory class gets beginners started on researching their family history. Participants are introduced to genealogy basics and a 5-Step Research Model to guide genealogical research. Vital records are illustrated to demonstrate how to mine documents for genealogical information.

Part 2 – The Part II class goes beyond vital records to cover census, military, social security and immigration records. Each record set is discussed and illustrated for its genealogical value. Special attention is given to the 1940 U.S. Federal Census.

This class is particularly useful for Seniors who want to prepare their family collection to pass on to others.
